Purpose

This Agreement outlines the educational services to which you are entitled as a Navigate to Nursing (N2N) scholarship program recipient at Chamberlain College of Nursing. Academic requirements and your obligations are also covered.

Tuition/Fees

Tuition and fees for N2N students will be covered via the N2N scholarship program. Students who apply for admission to Chamberlain and pursue a degree prior to completion of the N2N scholarship program may be eligible for other scholarship options, however, they will not be eligible for the N2N scholarship while pursuing a degree program at Chamberlain. All coursework materials will be the student's responsibility and are not covered or supplied by Chamberlain.

Academic Credit

N2N scholarship program recipients who wish to become degree candidates must meet Chamberlain College of Nursing admission requirements. If accepted, credits earned through the N2N scholarship program will apply toward a degree program at Chamberlain. Transfer of credit requires approval by Chamberlain's registrar. Course credits are not guaranteed to transfer to other schools. Acceptance of credits is subject to the receiving institution's requirements. Chamberlain cannot guarantee that credits earned through the N2N scholarship program will transfer to any other college or university. Acceptance of transfer credit awarded by institutions other than Chamberlain is at the discretion of Chamberlain.

General Information

Chamberlain reserves the right to alter the number of credits or contact hours for reasons including, but not limited to, the following: natural occurrences and other circumstances beyond Chamberlain's control, holidays, special institutional activity days, and registration days. Course availability varies by location.

Chamberlain reserves the right to discontinue the instruction of a student whose conduct is, in its judgment, unsatisfactory. Students who breach Chamberlain rules or generally acceptable standards of good conduct will be dismissed. Chamberlain reserves the right to suspend or cancel instruction and to cancel a starting class or section if enrollment is insufficient. Applications for a forming class may be taken through the end of late registration only.

This Agreement terminates when the student completes the N2N scholarship program, or becomes a Chamberlain matriculating student. Students who do not register for a subsequent semester must execute a new special enrollment agreement prior to resuming. Matriculating students must complete a new enrollment agreement at the time of acceptance into a Chamberlain degree program.

Grades and attempted hours in the N2N scholarship program will be included in the students cumulative grade point average and will factor into academic progression should the student continue with Chamberlain as a degree seeking student.

Except by any attached printed addenda to this Agreement, written by Chamberlain and acknowledged by applicant, this Agreement is not subject to oral or written modification from its printed form. This Agreement supersedes any Chamberlain enrollment agreement you may have previously signed.

Purchase of Texts and Supporting Material

All coursework materials will be the student's responsibility and are not covered or supplied by Chamberlain. Students can purchase coursework materials at either a campus location or online at chamberlain.edu/bookstore.

In lieu of receiving rent from the operator of its bookstores, Chamberlain receives commissions derived from the gross revenue collected by the bookstore operator from both on-campus and internet sales. Admission Requirements

Eligible students must be in their senior year, attending a state approved high school. Potential students must submit an official transcript that reflects a minimum cumulative grade point average of a 3.2. The academic manager will place documentation in the student's file that the standard college admissions requirements have been waived for the N2N scholarship program. If applicant has not reached the age of majority under state law in the state of applicant's residence, co-signature of a parent or legal guardian will be required prior to admission.

N2N Continued Scholarship Eligibility

- A student must obtain at least a B in NR103 or NR101 and pass the A2 admissions assessment with a minimum custom score of 73 on the A2 Admission Assessment test to progress beyond NR103 or NR101. The custom score is calculated by using a subset of all seven exam scores.
- A student must place standard on the math placement test, or have a qualifying ACT Math or SAT Math score to progress beyond NR103 or 101.
- A student must place standard on the English placement test, or have a qualifying ACT English or SAT Verbal/Critical Reading score to progress beyond NR103 or NR101.
- A student must earn a minimum of a "C" in all other courses (non-nursing) attempted unless otherwise stated in the academic catalog.
- A N2N student is allowed to withdraw from one course while enrolled in the N2N scholarship program. If a student withdraws from a course a second time, they will be permitted to complete all other currently enrolled courses, but will not be eligible to register for additional sessions or courses.
- A student must pass all N2N courses. If a student fails any N2N course, they are no longer eligible for additional scholarship courses.
- Comply with all Chamberlain academic and attendance policies.

N2N students must review the Chamberlain College of Nursing academic catalog for all student policies and procedures at chamberlain.edu/catalog. Please note N2N students are not eligible for career service, housing assistance, part-time employment assistance, Veterans Administration benefits, tutoring, ASPIRE counseling services, or financial aid.
