The denominator of the primary rate was defined as all students who graduated within the calendar year. In the secondary rate, the denominator excluded students who did not respond to the alumni survey, were continuing their education, were international and unable to work, had medical or personal issues, had national service, had pending licensure, or refused employment for other reasons. The employment rates were calculated by dividing the numerator by the denominator. "New Employment" is defined as employment obtained no earlier than 6 months prior to graduation. "Existing employment" is defined as employment that existed at time of enrollment or was obtained more than 6 months prior to graduation.
