ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

1. Acceptance in a Chamberlain University degree program* (colleagues of Adtalem Global Education or any Adtalem Global Education institution are not eligible to apply for these scholarships.)
2. If a student is eligible for multiple benefits (special Chamberlain University tuition rate and/or multiple grants/scholarships), students' best financial interest will be applied, unless otherwise noted.
3. Benefits will not be awarded in excess of tuition within each semester.

NOTE: Benefits recipients are responsible for all other educational expenses. Chamberlain University reserves the right to change the terms, conditions and availability of benefits at any time without notice.

PRE-LICENSURE UNDERGRADUATE GRANTS/SCHOLARSHIPS

Navigate to Nursing (N2N) Scholarship Program

A merit-based scholarship providing assistance toward tuition and fees* to allow qualified high school seniors to begin earning college credit toward their Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) degree while still in high school. All credits are completed under the predetermined N2N scholarship program curriculum.



UP TO \$8,775* IN ASSISTANCE TOWARDS TUITION & FEES FOR CURRICULUM IN THE N2N PROGRAM

Availability: Varies by location

Verification Requirements:

- Submission of official high school transcripts
- Submission of application and parental consent form for applicants under the age of 18
- Review and approval by the Chamberlain University admission committee

Eligibility:

- Limited to seniors from high schools recognized by Chamberlain University
- Minimum high school CGPA of 3.2 on a 4.0 scale
- A letter of recommendation

Continuing Education Scholarship

A merit-based scholarship providing tuition assistance for students who have completed a bachelor's degree in another field at a regionally accredited college or university.

\$2,500 PER SEMESTER (UP TO \$22,500)

Availability: Varies by location

Verification Requirements:

Transcripts from all prior institutions of higher education

Eligibility:

- Bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited institution or a bachelor's degree from a non-US institution that is equivalent to a regionally accredited institution in the US
- Acceptance into a Chamberlain University pre-licensure program
- Meet or exceed a score of 75 on the Admission Assessment (A2) (composite score)
- Minimum CGPA of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale from all prior institutions

Continued Eligibility:

- Minimum CGPA of 2.0 on a 4.0 scale

Deadline: Speak with your student support advisor for deadline details

Certified First Responder Scholarship

A merit based scholarship providing tuition assistance to certified or licensed first responders (EMT, paramedic, firefighter, etc.) looking to pursue a degree at Chamberlain.

\$1,000 PER SEMESTER (UP TO \$6,000)

Availability: Limited by available funds at the following campuses:

- Addison, Illinois
- Chicago, Illinois
- Tinley Park, Illinois

Initial Eligibility:

- Acceptance into a Chamberlain University pre-licensure program
- Meet or exceed a score of 80 on the Chamberlain A2 Admission Assessment
- Minimum CGPA of 2.75 on a 4.0 scale
- Minimum nine credit hours per semester enrollment
- Must have obtained one of the following:
 - Certification from a National Registry of Emergency Medical Technicians (NREMTS)
 - Certification or licensure as an EMT or Paramedic
- Continuing students are not eligible for this award

Continued Eligibility:

- Maintain a minimum 2.5 GPA on a 4.0 scale
- Students who drop below the enrollment minimum will lose their scholarship going forward, regardless of future enrollment levels
- Exceptions subject to campus president approval

Deadline: Speak with your admission representative for deadline details

Horizon Scholarship

A need-based scholarship providing tuition assistance for students who have shown exceptional need.

\$2,500 PER SEMESTER (UP TO \$22,500)

Availability: Varies by location

Eligibility:

- Acceptance into a Chamberlain University pre-licensure program
- Meet or exceed a score of 75 on the A2 assessment (composite score)
- FAFSA® Expected Family Contribution (EFC) of \$0
- Minimum CGPA of 2.75 on a 4.0 scale from all prior institutions

Continued Eligibility:

- Minimum CGPA of 2.0 on a 4.0 scale

PRE-LICENSURE UNDERGRADUATE GRANTS/SCHOLARSHIPS

Next Generation Scholarship

A merit based scholarship providing tuition assistance for recent high school graduates who have shown exceptional academic performance.

\$2,500 PER SEMESTER
(UP TO \$22,500)

Availability: Varies by location

Initial Eligibility:

- Acceptance into a Chamberlain University pre-licensure program
- Graduated high school in the last 24 months
- Minimum high school CGPA of 3.2 on a 4.0 scale
- Meet or exceed at least one of the following minimum scores:
 - 80 on the A2 assessment
 - 24 on the ACT (composite score)
 - 1100 on the SAT (critical reading and mathematical reasoning sections)
- Continuing students are not eligible for this award

Written Essay Portion:

If you meet the initial eligibility requirements, a written essay will be due.

Please speak with your admissions representative or student support advisor to learn the written essay deadline and receive the written essay portion of the scholarship.

Continued Eligibility:

- Maintain a minimum 3.0 GPA on a 4.0 scale
 - Exceptions subject to campus president approval
- Minimum of nine credit hours per semester enrollment
 - Students who drop below the enrollment minimum will lose their scholarship going forward, regardless of future enrollment levels
 - Exceptions subject to campus president approval

Deadline: See your admission representative for your campus deadline

Bridge Scholarship

A merit-based scholarship for students previously enrolled in a CCNE- or ACEN-accredited baccalaureate nursing program at another institution.

\$2,500 PER SEMESTER
(UP TO \$22,500)

Availability: Varies by location

Eligibility:

- Acceptance into a Chamberlain University pre-licensure program
- Meet or exceed a score of 75 on the A2 assessment (composite score)
- Minimum CGPA of 2.8 on a 4.0 scale from all prior institutions

Continued Eligibility:

- Minimum CGPA of 2.0 on a 4.0 scale

Deadline: Speak with your student support advisor for deadline details

Opportunity Scholarship

A merit based scholarship for new pre-licensure BSN students. Intended to reward academically excellent students who choose Chamberlain University.

\$1,000 PER SEMESTER
(UP TO \$6,000)

Availability: Varies by location

Initial Eligibility:

- Acceptance into a Chamberlain University pre-licensure program
- Meet or exceed a score of 80 on the A2 assessment (composite score)
- Continuing students are not eligible for this award

Continued Eligibility:

- Maintain a minimum 2.5 GPA on a 4.0 scale
 - Exceptions subject to campus president approval
- Minimum of nine credit hours per semester enrollment
 - Students who drop below the enrollment minimum will lose their scholarship going forward, regardless of future enrollment levels
 - Exceptions subject to campus president approval

DAISY Honoree Scholarship

A scholarship for registered nurses who have won The DAISY Award, The DAISY Team Award, The DAISY Nurse Leader Award, The DAISY in Training Award or The DAISY Faculty Award through The DAISY Foundation.

15 PERCENT SAVINGS ON TUITION

Availability: Limited by available funds

Verification Requirements:

- Copy of The DAISY Award certificate or;
- Verification from The DAISY Foundation

Eligibility:

- Recipient of The DAISY Award through their employer or school and The DAISY Foundation
- Enrollment in a Chamberlain University post-licensure program

Deadline: Two weeks prior to the start of the session

Working Parent Grant – RN to BSN

A grant for registered nurses with dependent children who are looking to pursue their BSN.

10 PERCENT SAVINGS ON TUITION (UP TO \$2,655)

Availability: Limited by available funds

Verification Requirements:

- Completed employment verification form

Eligibility:

- Licensed registered nurse
- Currently working as a registered nurse
- Ability to claim dependent children on their taxes per IRS guidelines
- Acceptance into the Chamberlain University RN to BSN degree completion option
- Minimum of three credit hours per semester

Continued Eligibility:

- Minimum 2.0 CGPA on a 4.0 scale

Deadline: Speak with your student support advisor for deadline details

New RN Grant

A grant program for students pursuing the RN to BSN online degree completion option and who have recently received their RN license within the last five years.

10 PERCENT SAVINGS ON TUITION (UP TO \$2,655)

Availability: Limited by available funds

Verification Requirements:

- ADN graduation date or original date of RN license must be within five years of acceptance into the RN to BSN degree completion option

Eligibility:

- Acceptance into the Chamberlain University RN to BSN degree completion option
- Not already participating in an institutional education program partner agreement
- Minimum three credit hours per semester

Continued Eligibility:

- Minimum 2.0 CGPA on a 4.0 scale

POST-LICENSURE & GRADUATE GRANTS/SCHOLARSHIPS

Working Parent Grant – MSN

A grant for registered nurses with dependent children, looking to pursue their Master of Science in Nursing (MSN) degree in an indirect care specialty track (educator, executive, healthcare policy or informatics).

15 PERCENT SAVINGS ON TUITION (UP TO \$3,480)

Availability: Limited by available funds

Verification Requirements:

- Completed employment verification form

Eligibility:

- Licensed registered nurse
- Currently working as a registered nurse
- Ability to claim dependent children on their taxes per IRS guidelines
- Acceptance into a Chamberlain University MSN degree program
- Minimum of three credit hours per semester

Continued Eligibility:

- Minimum 3.0 CGPA on a 4.0 scale in original nursing program

Deadline: Speak with your student support advisor for deadline details

Clinical Educator Scholarship

A scholarship for registered nurses with clinical experience, looking to become educators in a hospital or school setting.

\$580 PER SEMESTER (UP TO \$3,480)

Availability: Limited by available funds

Verification Requirements:

- Completed employment verification form signed by the candidate's employer at an eligible institution

Eligibility:

- Minimum of three credit hours per semester
- Licensed registered nurse
- Five or more years experience working in a clinical or hospital setting
- Acceptance and commitment in the Chamberlain University MSN degree program (educator specialty track)

Continued Eligibility:

- Minimum 3.0 CGPA on a 4.0 scale

Deadline: Speak with your student support advisor for deadline details.

Pioneer Grant – MPH

A grant for students pursuing a career in a public health related field.

30 PERCENT SAVINGS ON TUITION (UP TO \$6,930)

Availability: Limited by available funds

Eligibility:

- Must hold a bachelor's degree in any field
- Enrollment in public health coursework at Chamberlain University
- Minimum of three credit hours per semester
- Continuing students are not eligible for this award

Deadline: Speak with your student support advisor for deadline details.

Leading the Way Social Work Grant

A grant for students pursuing a Master of Social Work (MSW) degree.

30 PERCENT SAVINGS ON TUITION FOR COURSEWORK TAKEN THROUGH MAY 2020

Availability: This grant will expire at the end of the May 2020 session.

Eligibility:

- Must hold a bachelor's degree in any field with a minimum 2.5 CGPA on a 4.0 scale (traditional track) or 3.0 CGPA on a 4.0 scale (advanced standing track)
- Enrollment in social work coursework at Chamberlain University
- Minimum enrollment of three credit hours per semester
- Continuing students are not eligible for this award

Deadline: Speak with your student support advisor for deadline details
